The Score Project is a European project whose objectives include identifying, analysing and sharing methodologies developed at local level to promote inclusive sport for people from immigrant, asylum seeker and refugee backgrounds, as well as for those belonging to ethnic minorities.

In order to achieve this objective, the VIPS² research laboratory of the University of Rennes, partner of the project, has carried out a comparative study of local experiences in Europe on sport as inclusion and prevention of racism and racial discrimination. In the framework of the comparative study, an analysis of local methodologies and strategies and of the intervention and action methodologies of municipalities in Europe, especially the alliances created for the promotion of sport as a tool for the inclusion of social and cultural diversity, has been carried out.

One of the results of the comparative study is the creation of an interactive and participatory web map of local European experiences that can serve as a reference and be transferable to other European contexts.

On 21 March 2023 (International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination), a webinar will be held to present the preliminary results of the research and an interactive map of initiatives as a tool to identify and share them at European level.

The webinar is addressed to public institutions (national, regional and local), civil society organisations and sports organisations interested in the field of prevention of racism and xenophobia through sport.
